Pursuant to the Acts for the Relief of Insolvent Debtors in England.

IN THE COURT FOR RELIEF OF INSOLVENT DEBTORS.

COURT of WILLIAM JOHN LAW Esquire, Commissioner,

On the Fourteenth Day of August, 1852.

UPON the filing of the SCHEDULE of LODEWYK HAVEKES, (sued with Thomas Terry,) formerly of Boomsloot, afterwards of Vilooveniers, Burgoral, both in the City of Amsterdam, in the Kingdom of Holland, Carpenter and Builder, his Wife a Provision Dealer, then still of Vilooveniers, Burgoral aforesaid, Provision Merchant, carrying on business with Johan Bernhard Eilers, afterwards of No. 24, Cannon Street, London, in Copartnership with him and Thomas Terry, carrying on Business as Provision Merchants, Cheese and Butter Factors, and General Merchants, then of No. 10, Cross Lane, Saint Mary-at-Hill, Lower Thames Street, London, carrying on the same business with the said Thomas Terry and Johan Bernhard Eilers, under the names, firm, and style of Havekes and Terry, having a Store at No. 11, Nag's Head Court, Gracechurch Street, London, the said Johan Bernhard Eilers carried on the business of Provision Merchant and Dealer in his own name, at Warmoes Street, in the City of Amsterdam, in the Kingdom of Holland,) and late residing at No. 16, Providence Row, Worship Street, Finsbury, Middlesex, carrying on business at No. 10, Cross Lane, Eastcheap, London, in copartnership with the said Johan Bernhard Eilers and Thomas Terry, as Provision Merchants, Cheese and Butter Factors, and General Merchants, a Prisoner in the Debtors' Prison for London and Middlesex, whose Estate and Effects have been duly Vested in the Provisional Assignee by Order pursuant to the Statute:

IT IS ORDERED and APPOINTED that the said Prisoner shall be brought up to be dealt with according to the provisions of the said Act before the Court of WILLIAM JOHN LAW Esquire, Commissioner, at the Court House, in Portugal Street, Lincoln's Inn Fields, on the Twenty-first day of September next, at the hour of TEN in the Morning precisely: of which all Creditors and persons claiming to be Creditors of the said Insolvent for the Sum of Five Pounds or more shall have Notice by Service of a Copy of this Order made within such Time and in such Manner as is prescribed by the Rule of Court in that behalf.

BY THE COURT.

**TAKE NOTICE.**

1. If any Creditor intends to OPPOSE the said Prisoner's Discharge, NOTICE of such Intention must be given by ENTRY thereof in the proper Page and Columns of the BOOK kept for that purpose at the Office of the Court, between the hours of **ELEVEN** in the forenoon and **THREE** in the afternoon, Two CLEAR Days before the Day of Hearing abovementioned EXCLUSIVE of Sunday, and EXCLUSIVE both of the Days of entering such Notice and of the said Day of Hearing:—Notice to PRODUCE at the Hearing any BOOKS or PAPERS filed with the Schedule must be given to the Officer having the Custody thereof, within the same Hours on any Day previous to the said Day of Hearing.

N.B. Entrance to the Office in Portugal Street.

2. The Petition and Schedule, and all Books, Papers, and Writings filed therewith, will be produced by the proper Officer for INSPECTION and EXAMINATION, until the last Day for entering Opposition inclusive, ON THIS NOTICE BEING EXHIBITED:—and COPIES of the Petition and Schedule, or such part thereof as shall be required, will be provided by the proper Officer according to the Act 1 and 2 Vict. c. 110, sect. 105.

3. Opposition at the Hearing can only be made by the Creditor in Person, or by Counsel appearing for him
